Under NEP 2020 the universities in India have been presented with an opportunity to offer undergraduate (UG) programmes of study alongside postgraduate (PG) and doctoral programmes. Since its establishment in 2019, Bhattadev University is however already running its teaching programmes with special emphasis on UG education. It is to be hoped that as a University, we are well placed to prepare employable bachelor's degree holders for serving in the private as well as the public sectors.

- 3. Three & Four-Year Bachelor of Science with Single Major: B.Sc. in Botany, Chemistry, Computer Science, Geography, Mathematics, Physics, Statistics and Zoology.
- 4. Three & Four-Year Bachelor of Science with Double Major: B.Sc. in Botany, Chemistry, Computer Science, Geography, Mathematics, Physics, Statistics and Zoology.
- 5. Five-Year Integrated M.A. (Master of Arts) Programme in Sanskrit.
- 6. Five-Year Integrated M.Com. (Master of Commerce).
- 7. Five-Year Integrated M.Sc. (Master of Science) Programme in Chemistry
- 8. Two-Year Master of Arts: M.A. in Assamese, Economics, English and Political Science.
- 9. Two-Year Master of Commerce (M.Com.)
- 10. Two-Year Master of Science: M.Sc. in Chemistry, Botany, Geography, Mathematics, Physics, Statistics and Zoology.
- 11. Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) in all departments having eligible Ph.D. supervisors.

The Ph.D. programmes in Assamese, Chemistry, Geography, Mathematics, Physics, and Zoology were launched in 2020 with a view to starting research activities at the university. During current session, the university is likely to announce Ph.D. programmes in all of its academic departments.

The university has already drawn up a plan to offer a significant number of attractive skill-based, value-addition and scholastic courses from the Infosys Springboard and SWAYAM platforms to enrich its curriculum further.

THE UNIVERSITY AT A GLANCE

Bhattadev University is one of the three new universities that were established in 2019 by the Government of Assam by upgrading three well-established colleges of Assam. Bajali College, a NAAC 'A' Grade college founded on 16 August 1955 at Pathsala town in the present-day Bajali district of Assam, formally started functioning as Bhattadev University with effect from 24 June 2019, the date on which Prof. Birinchi Kumar Das assumed his office as the first Vice-Chancellor of the University.

It is the realization of a long cherished dream of the people of greater Bajali to have a university in Bajali. Aptly enough, the new university has been named after an illustrious son of Assam and a son of the soil from the greater Bajali region, Vaikunthanaath Bhagavat Bhattacharya who is acknowledged as the father of Assamese prose. Bhattadev's legendary rendition in religious congregations and command over the Sanskrit *Shrimadbhagavatam* (translated by him into Assamese prose as *Katha Bhagavat*), the essential shastra forming the fulcrum of Assamese Vaishnava Dharma revolving around Krishna *Charitra*, earned him the title of Bhagavat Bhattacharya, shortened to **Bhattadev** by his followers.



The UGC has recognized Bhattadev University as an institution "empowered to award degrees as specified by the UGC under section 22 of the UGC Act 1956 by conducting courses through its own departments, its constituent colleges and/or through its affiliated colleges in regular mode with the approval of concerned statutory bodies/councils" vide its letter F. No. 9-12/2019 (CPP-I/PU) dated 25 September 2019.

In its journey to establish itself as a nationally recognized and modern university, Bhattadev University has taken a series of initiatives to improve its physical infrastructure and also to induct teachers of highest possible quality and best possible background.

In addition to Nineteen Four Year Undergraduate Programmes in important Arts and Science disciplines, the university currently offers twelve Two Year Postgraduate (M.A. M.Sc. & M.Com) programmes in Assamese, Botany, Chemistry, Commerce, Economics, English, Geography, Mathematics, Physics, Political Science, Statistics and Zoology. The University also offers Integrated M.A. Programme in Sanskrit, Integrated M.Sc. Programme in Chemistry and Integrated M.Com. Programme in Commerce. The Ph.D. programmes in Assamese, Chemistry, Geography, Mathematics, Physics, and Zoology were launched in 2020 with a view to starting research activities at the university. During current session, the university is likely to announce Ph.D. programmes in all of its academic departments. Furthermore, the university is also likely to add an expansive state-of-the-art Second Campus at Medhikuchi in the north-west of the existing campus at Pathsala In addition, the University, under the dynamic leadership of Prof. Birinchi Kumar Das, is striving hard to establish itself as a centre of excellence and has already taken many steps in many directions to emulate the achievements and contributions of reputed institutions like Gauhati University, Tezpur University, IIT Guwahati and others from within and outside the country.



INFRASTRUCTURE & AMENITIES

Bhattadev University located in the campus of erstwhile Bajali College at Pathsala town of Bajali Civil Sub-division of Barpeta District, Assam spreading over 16 acres of land. The green campus also has space for future expansion.

Physical Facilities:

The Institution has adequate infrastructure facilities for curricular and extra-curricular programmes. The infrastructure is used to the maximum extent, and all students have easy access to the existing learning resources. Its management policy is to modernize, maintain and upkeep infrastructural facilities according to emerging needs of teaching and learning. There are Two Arts Buildings, One three storey Science Building, One three storey New Academic Building, One Library cum Information Technology Centre Building, One Auditorium, (Renovated Building) One Non-Resident Students' Centre, two Girls' Hostels, etc. There are also designated spaces for car & bike parking, bicycle-sheds, etc.

Being a new University, Bhattadev University has plans to strengthen and augment its present infrastructure in the existing campus and also to expand into a new second campus. With Government financial assistance a few construction and renovation projects namely the Administration Block including offices of the Vice-Chancellor and Registrar with One AC Conference Hall and a modernized classroom complex have been completed. More renovation work is going on to prepare modernized classrooms, laboratories and instrument rooms for the students. Efforts are being taken to construct a recording studio for use by the students of the Department of Mass Communication & Journalism and also to facilitate the production of lectures for digital content. The Government of Assam has recently allocated a sum of Rs. 50 crores to the University for Infrastructure Development and this should bring in a sea change to the overall infrastructure of the university.

- 1. Auditorium: The University has one auditorium with a seating capacity of 300 and there are provisions of required furniture and sound system, etc.
- 2. Digital Conference Hall: There are two well-equipped air-conditioned Conference Halls having a combined seating capacity of about 110–150.
- **3. Students' Day Home:** There is a Non-Resident Students' Home on the University premises with separate rooms for Boys and Girls. The facilities for the common rooms are being upgraded. In addition to this, there are different toilet units available for girls and boys on the campus including the Girls' Toilet block.
- **4. Staff Room for Teachers:** There is a well-furnished Teachers' Common Room which also serves as a Meeting Room from time to time.
- **5. Power Supply:** To back up the APDCL supply, two diesel generators are installed to ensure uninterrupted power supply in the campus including hostels.
- **6. Solar Power Plant:** Under Integrated Power Development Scheme (IPDS) scheme of the Government APDCL has recently set up a roof-top solar power plant with a production capacity of 330 kW. It became operational on 18-05-2020.
- 7. **Drinking Water facilities:** The University has its own water treatment plant and also a water supply system. Purified drinking water facilities are available throughout the campus
- **8. Rain Water Harvesting:** The University has developed an efficient mechanism for rainwater harvesting and facilities of rainwater harvesting are available on the university premises.
- **9. Facilities of Games & Sports:** The University has its infrastructure for Games and Sports such as playground with a football field, volleyball court, tennis court & a gymnasium. By utilizing these facilities, students ensure participation at District, University and State Level Competitions.
- **10.Vermicompost Project:** Recently one Vermicompost Project has been set up in the university campus and a Mushroom Plant is also going to start with the joint initiative of Assam Science Society, Bajali Branch and Bhattadev University Teachers' Association.

Academic Facilities:

The University has the following facilities to meet emerging needs of teaching and learning.

- 1. Classrooms: The institution has sixty (60) spacious, well-ventilated classrooms and tutorial spaces. All classrooms have adequate seating and other teaching-learning facilities.
- 2. Smart Classrooms: There are six smart classrooms equipped with modern teaching-learning tools like whiteboards, green boards, interactive boards, LCD projectors, podiums, etc.
- 3. Laboratories: There are 32 well-equipped laboratories for UG & PG classes. An air-conditioned Centralized Computer Laboratory and a newly created Computer Laboratory in the Mathematics Department for UG and PG classes are also available. In the recent past, the University has procured scientific equipments and computers worth over Rs. 1 crore to raise its experimental facilities via effective utilization of Government fund.
- **4. Bio-Tech Hub**: There is an Institutional Bio-Tech Hub sponsored by Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Government of India. Efforts are on to add more instruments and other facilities into it so that students are able to access modern facilities to be required for UG and PG dissertation works.
- 5. Central Library: The Institution has a well-furnished and fully automated Central Library. The Library is automated with KOHA software. More than 36,000 books and a good number of journals, newspapers and periodicals, e-books, etc. are available in the Library. The Library has adequate space for internet browsing, and photo copying for students and faculties. All the staff and students have access to INFLIBNET resources. Besides, an extensive collection of digital texts has been made available to the students in the University Library from which students can copy their required study materials. Utilizing Government fund, the university has substantially augmented library resources via the inclusion of text and reference books, career guidance and personality development books, magazines and journals, EBSCO e-Book and e-Journal databases and more. In addition to the central Library, all departments have Departmental Seminar Libraries too.
- 6. IT infrastructure: The institution has more than 120 computers with UPS power backup. All the departments have been provided with computers and laser printers. ICT tools are used for teaching-learning. LAN facility is available in the University Office and Central Library. Internet connectivity is available in all departments and the Central Library and Computer Lab through Wi-Fi. Wi-Fi facility is also available for the students in the Central Library.
- 7. Museums: There are two museums having rare collections in the departments of Zoology and Geography.
- **8. Botanical Garden:** The University has a small Botanical Garden with a greenhouse. A Floriculture Garden and a **Pisciculture** Pond are there in the campus.
- 9. University Website: Bhattadev University website www.bhattadevuniversity.ac.in has been in existence for four years and efforts are being made to make it an interactive and useful one providing information learning resources in English and Assamese to students as well as teachers.
- 10. University Press: Bhattadev University also has a printing press of its own.
- 11. **Xerox Facility:** Photocopiers are available in the offices and Library of the University.

Support Services:

The University has the following support services and facilities for students and we are looking forward to adding more soon.

1. **Hostel Facilities**: The University has two (02) hostels for girl students with a total accommodation capacity of about **100**.

- 2. National Cadet Corps (NCC): The University has following two NCC Companies
 - I) 7 Assam NCC Bn.
 - II) 60 Assam Girls' NCC Bn.
- **3. National Service Scheme (NSS) Cell:** The NSS cell of Bhattadev University is constituted with the following two NSS wings:

- **4. Canteen:** A canteen facility is available on the campus where students and teachers can have hygienic food at reasonable rates.

Guidelines of FYUGP

1. Introduction

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) under Bhattadev University is based on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The policy recognizes that education plays a primary role in moulding and shaping the destiny of the nation. The policy endeavours to develop India in accordance with the values enshrined in our Constitution- a democratic, just, socially conscious, cultured and humane nation upholding liberty, equality, fraternity and justice for all. The new policy therefore attempts to synthesize and harmonize the knowledge of ancient India and the emerging knowledge of the different fields so that the education system produces world leaders in all fields of human endeavour. The system wants to do away with rote learning and encourage critical thinking, logical decision making and innovation. It wants to reestablish India once again as world or global teacher (vishwaguru) across all fields of knowledge as it once was in the ancient time. The FYUGP is designed to fulfill the diverse academic needs of the student and seeks to offer options of multiple entries/exits and obtain a Certificate or a Diploma or Degree with Major or a Degree (Honours) or a Degree (Honours) with Research at various levels as stipulated under the policy.

1. 1 Objectives

- 1. The primary object of this Regulation is to identify and foster the unique qualities of each learner and to promote a holistic development of the learner.
- 2. It also attempts to provide the learners with the opportunity to choose their learning programmes and progress in life according to their interests or talents.
- 3. The policy attempts to provide interdisciplinary and holistic education drawing from different subjects and disciplines for a new emerging world of interdependence between different disciplines.
- 4. The policy emphases on conceptual understanding, critical thinking and innovations.
- 5. The policy upholds human ethics and constitutional values of our country and emphasizes on building life skills like the team work, leadership and communications.
- 6. The policy emphasizes on the use of technology in teaching and learning and removes all kinds of language learning barriers.
- 7. The policy endeavours to ensure respect for the heterogeneous culture of India and promote local language and knowledge through the various stages in the curriculum.
- 8. The policy emphasizes on equity and inclusion in matters of all educational decisions so that all students can thrive in that environment.
- 9. The underlying policy is to ensure that the education system is rooted in the values of Indian civilization and its rich, diverse, ancient and modern culture, language, knowledge system and traditions.

1. 2 Curricular goals

The curricular and credit framework of FYUGP under NEP 2020 seeks to ensure the following for the students:

- Flexibility to move from one discipline of study to another
- Opportunity for learners to choose the courses of their interest in all disciplines
- ❖ Facilitating multiple entry and exit options with UG certificate or UG diploma or degree depending upon the number of credits secured
- Flexibility for learners to move from one institution to another to enable them to have multi and/or interdisciplinary learning
- ❖ Flexibility to switch to alternative modes of learning (online, ODL, and Online learning, and hybrid modes of learning).

3. Admission

3.1 Eligibility for admission into FYUGP

- ❖ A student who has passed 12th standard or equivalent examination in any stream from a recognized institution.
- Admission to the FYUGP will be based on the preference on the disciplines to be chosen as Major and Minor. At the end of 2nd Semester, student may request to alter the major and minor, subject to the availability of seats and marks obtained in the 1st year.
- Admission to a Programme or Major will be subject to availability of the subject and capacity of a department and also on the criteria set by the concerned departments.
- No student shall be eligible for admission to a Programme in any discipline under the FYUGP unless she/he fulfils the pre-requisites of courses as fixed by the university.

3.2 Reservation

Statutory reservation policy of the Government of Assam shall be followed in case of selection of eligible candidates for admission.

4. Programme and curricular components

4.1 Overview and structure

The complete FYUGP consists of 8 semesters, to be completed in a minimum of 4 academic years. Each academic year has two semesters. Each semester has a minimum credit allocation of 20. All together the minimum credit requirements for a 3-year programme is 120 and for a 4-year programme, its 160. The minimum credit requirements for BU's FYUGP are as follows:

^{*}For Exit after 1st or 2nd year, students have to complete a mandatory vocational course of credit 4 during the summer vacation.

4.4 Curricular Components

The entire FYUGP curriculum is divided into two parts— (a) Core Courses and (b) Common Courses, which are described below.

4.4.1 Core courses

The core courses constitute Majors and Minors. A student will choose one Major subject and a Minor subject. Different options are described in the next section. All core courses have a credit allocation of 4. Altogether, irrespective of any Major or Minor options, a student will necessarily need to study 21 courses with total credit allocation of 84 over a 3-year programme. In four year programme, minimum credit for major is 80 and minor is 32.

Major Course

The minimum credit requirements for a Major Course over a 3-year period are 60 accumulated from 15 Courses and 80 credits for 4 years UG programme from 20 Courses.

Minor Course

The minimum credit requirements for a Minor Course over a 3-year period for 24 accumulated from 6 papers and 32 credits for 4 years UG programme from 8 Courses.

Double Major Course

Provided a student has a Major Course with 60 credits, s/he can convert his/her Minor Course to a Double Major only with a credit allocation of 48 for 3 years and 64 for 4 years.

4.4.2 Common courses

As per the NEP guidelines, the following courses will have to be studied by all students of FYUGP:

(a) Value Added Courses (VAC): The VAC courses will come from four subgroups— (i) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. All together they will have a credit allocation of 8.

Each student will have to take any two courses, each of 4-credits, from any four groups during Semesters 1 & 2. Here one course from the Environmental Science group is compulsory except if the student takes a core course on Environmental Science.

- **(b) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** It includes Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication) and AEC is divided into four Courses each of credit 2 from semester I to IV. Each student needs to complete four courses of 2 credits each—two from English Usage and other two from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. These courses have to be taken during Semesters 1—4.
- **(c) Interdisciplinary Courses:** These are 3-credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects— (i) Natural and Physics Science, (ii) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications, (iii) Library, Information and Media Sciences, (iv) Commerce and Management and (v) Humanities and Social Sciences. The level of these courses is of 0–99. Each student needs to take up any three courses; each with 3-credits from these five sub-groups during Semesters I–III and these courses should not be studied at higher secondary level.
- **(d) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. In our structure, we shall have 3 (three) skill courses starting from Semesters I–III.
- **(e) Internship:** All students are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out within six semesters. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.
- **(f) Vocational Courses:** Vocational courses help individuals develop skills for specific trades like crafts, trades, and technician roles. A student has to take a vocational course of 4-credit for getting a certificate and one more vocational course of same credit to get a diploma as per NEP 2020.

4.6 Academic Bank of Credits

All credits a student earns at the end of an examination in BU-FYUGP will be deposited in the ABC by the university.

As such it is mandatory that a student under BU-FYUGP registers for the ABC as notified by the regulatory agencies.

5. Progression and exits

The progression and exits during the whole course structure is given below.

(a) After 1 Year (Certificate in UG programme)

One can exit just after one-year. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational course (Exit Course) of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a *Certificate*. The minimum total credit requirement is 40 (and 4 credits extra for the exit vocational course).

(b) After 2 Years (Diploma in UG programme)

One can exit the programme after two-years as well. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra vocational course of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Diploma. The minimum total credit requirement is 80 (and 4 credits extra for the exit vocational course).

(c) After 3 Years (UG Degree)

If a student completes 3 years and earns required credit, she/he will be awarded Bachelor's Degree with major or with double major.

(d) After 4 Years

After completion of 4 years, the student gets either a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research with single or double major depending on the credit s/he has earned. Students will be eligible for Honours with Research, if she/he earns at least 75% marks or equivalent CGPA in the first six semesters. For Honours with Research student need to a 12 credit Course on Research Project/Dissertation.

6. Inter-university mobility

The BU-FYUGP allows a student for inter-university mobility, both for incoming and outgoing students. For this, BU will take into account the credits a student has in his/her ABC. For an incoming student, the following should be observed:

- The entry is subject to availability of seats in the concerned discipline.
- The student needs to fulfil all the academic prerequisites of the concerned discipline.

8. Choices of courses

8.1 Prerequisites

Prerequisites are conditions which need to be fulfilled prior to admission into the FYUGP. Each subject and its course (paper) have their own prerequisites, which need to be fulfilled by a student prior to enrolment. For example, having Class XII-level Mathematics is a prerequisite to opt for Physics at the FYUGP. Here, having a prerequisite necessarily means that the student needs to have passed in the subject. The details of these prerequisites are available in the FYUGP Information Booklet.

8.2 Requirements

As opposed to prerequisites, the requirements are conditions which need to be fulfilled when a student chooses a certain subject or course. For example, when a student wants to study Botany as a subject, Chemistry as another subject must be studied. The details of the requirements are available in the FYUGP Information Booklet.

8.3 Course options

Subject to fulfilment of prerequisites and requirements, a student can choose any subject as core subjects. The nomenclature of the degree awarded (whether Bachelor of Arts or Science) will be decided by the group to which at least two subjects belong.

ii) Vocational Courses:

(a) After 1 Year (Certificate in UG Programme)

One can exit just after one-year. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational Course (Exit Course) of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Certificate. The minimum total credit requirement is 40 (and 4 credits extra for the exit Vocational Course).

(b) After 2 Years (Diploma in UG Programme)

One can exit the programme after two-years as well. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational Course of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Diploma. The minimum total credit requirement is 80 (and 4 credits extra for the exit Vocational Course).

ii) Minor Courses: The minimum credit requirements for a Minor Course over a 3-year period for 24 accumulated from 6 papers and 32 credits for 4 years UG programme from 8 courses. A student can opt for two core courses against his/her chosen subjects from the following list:

ADMISSION PROCEDURE & COUNSELLING

- 1. Those students who desire to get admitted in Bhattadev University must visit the university website: www.bhattadevuniversity.ac.in and they should download this Brochure. The various programmes offered by the University will be mentioned there. They have to apply through SAMARTH.
- 2. Schedule of Admission: Government of Assam's Schedule of Admission will be followed strictly.
- 3. Merit lists for the programmes will be prepared by the marks obtained in Higher Secondary Final examination after considering reservation criteria as per Assam Government rules and regulations.
- 4. The provisional list of selected candidates, who are eligible for admission, will be displayed in the University Website.
- 5. The selected candidates will be informed about document verification date and requirements through the website.
- 6. It is the responsibility of the candidate to ensure the accuracy of data provided and the documents uploaded. In case of inconsistencies and mismatches between documents uploaded and the originals, the candidature may be/will be rejected.
- 7. After document verification, a candidate has to pay the admission fee through SBI Collect linked with Bhattadev

University Website, the admission process is completed. The candidate has to deposit the payment receipt to the office.

- 8. If a student does not accept the admission offer within a specified date and time, his/her candidature will be rejected.
- 9. If a student has applied for two programmes and is selected in all the programmes opted for, she/he has the option of choosing anyone. Once a programme is selected his seat in the other program will be automatically vacated and will be allotted to next candidate in order of merit.

RESERVATION OF SEATS IN UG & PG PROGRAMMES

As per Government of Assam rules, the benefit of reservation shall be given only to those sections which are listed in the central list published by the Government of Assam.

Candidates belonging to OBC & MOBC, SC, ST (Plains & Hills), UR-Economically Weaker Section (UR-EWS) and Person With Disability (PWD) and Extracurricular Activities (EC) categories will be given the benefit of reservation as per the Assam Government Reservation Policy. However, Employee- 1% seats will be reserved on horizontal basis, subject to the condition that the candidate fulfills other minimum eligibility requirements. Submission of a certificate to this effect issued by a competent Authority/Board (see below) shall be mandatory at the time of counseling.

For the purpose of reservation under UR-EWS category, a person belonging to the Economically Weaker Section whose family income is below **Rs. 8 Lakh** in a/the last financial year and his/her family does not own or possess any of the following assets:

- (a) 5 acres of agricultural land and above.
- (b) Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above.
- (c) Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities.
- (d) Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities.
- ❖ In case the reserved seats remain vacant even after the second counseling, the seats reserved for SC/ST may be interchanged and would be filled in the last counseling. If the seats belonging to SC/ST category candidates remain vacant and the lists of both the SC/ST categories are exhausted on the last date of counseling, the remaining vacant seats shall be filled by unreserved category (UR) candidates after the notified duration of the last counseling elapses.
- Consideration of meritorious candidates of reserved categories as unreserved candidates: If the merit of a reserved category candidate is more than or equal to the merit of the last admitted general candidate, the reserved category candidate will be treated as unreserved. Provided further that, if a meritorious reserved category candidate is admitted by relaxing the general qualifying standards (minimum eligibility requirement and/or age) which she/he would not have got by remaining under the unreserved category, then his/her admission shall be adjusted against the concerned reserved category quota and the consequential vacancy created in the unreserved category shall be filled up by a general category candidate in order of merit.

Certificates Required for Reserved Categories:

OBC&MOBC/SC/ST: Each OBC & MOBC/SC/ST candidate has to submit a scanned copy of the original caste certificate from competent authorities. The following are empowered to issue the certificate:

(i) District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Commissioner/Addl. Deputy Commissioner/Deputy Collector/First Class Stipendiary Magistrate/City Magistrate/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate/Executive Magistrate/Extra Assistant Commissioner,

(ii) Chief Presidency Magistrate/Addl. Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate,

O

(iii) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.

(iv) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and/or his family resides,

or

(v) Administrator/Secretary to the Administrator/Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands).

Candidates must note that Certificate from any other person/authority shall not be accepted in any case. If the candidate claims to belong to SC or ST category, his/her caste/tribe must be listed in the appropriate Government of India/Assam schedule. The Caste Certificate should clearly state: (a) Name of his/her caste/tribe (b)whether she/he belongs to SC or ST (c) District and the State or Union Territory of his/her usual place of residence and (d) the appropriate Govt. of India schedule under which his/her caste/ tribe is approved as SC or ST.

Person with Disability (PWD): Visually Impaired and/ or Hearing Impaired and/or Orthopedically Handicapped (on horizontal reservation basis) candidates, have to submit a self-attested copy of Disability Certificate issued by the District Chief Medical Officer/Medical Board. The disability benefits will be given to those candidates only who have at least 40% physical impairments. The percentage of disability should be mentioned in the certificate. The physical disability may be verified by a medical practitioner when the same will be possible.

UR-Economically Weaker Section (UR-EWS): The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Income and Asset Certificate issued by any one of the following authorities in the prescribed format as given in Annexure-VII shall only be accepted as proof of the candidate's claim as belonging to EWS.

- (i) District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/ Collector/ Deputy Commissioner/Additional Deputy Commissioner/1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/Extra Assistant Commissioner
- (ii) Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate
- (iii) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar and
- (iv) Sub-Divisional Officer or the area where the candidate and/or his family normally resides.
